



## Chapter 15: American Fork

### **Introduction:**

The cliff walls of American Fork Canyon climb above--in places at dizzying heights-- and the beauty of the multiple 11,000-foot peaks that surround the area inspire awe. Winter in this area is something not to be missed.

The trails listed in this chapter consist of trails designated for multi-use as well as trails not accessible by snowmobiles. Please note that American Fork Canyon lacks avalanche maintenance during the winter, so make sure stable conditions prevail before heading into the canyon. Call for avalanche information before you go.

American Fork Canyon is a fee canyon. There are self-serve fee tubes at major trailheads. Cost - \$3 for a 3-day pass.

**Warm-Ups:** Thanksgiving Point, found on the west side of I-15, a straight shot down from American Fork Canyon, has several great places to stop and eat. For a sandwich, soup, or salad, there is a deli and a couple café's on the property. The deli's menu runs under \$7.
