



Chapter 7: North Fork Park Area: North of the town of Liberty

North Fork Park takes its name from the north fork of the Ogden River. The park is found up Ogden Canyon by crossing the Pineview Dam and following the road north to Liberty. Campgrounds, horse corrals, and several miles of roads at the base of Ben Lomond Peak make up the park. During the winter it is ideal for ski touring and snowshoeing. The park is maintained by Weber County, but during the winter The Utah Nordic Alliance grooms the roads for Nordic skiing. Snowshoers share the groomed road, but also have the opportunity to explore off the beaten path. The park is isolated, wild, and gives a real sense of solitude unless you run into a scout group building snow caves. Two entrances, a northern and southern entrance, give access to the park. Both are clearly marked, and each of the following trail descriptions give more detail on finding them.
